Transfer Program Description: Historians broaden our understanding of our world by objectively viewing civilizations and our own national and state heritage. Students choosing to major in history examine such questions as whether the Civil War was unavoidable, or how World War II and the Vietnam War still influence politics today. Students majoring in History typically follow the pathway through the History Program at Austin Community College, then transfer to a bachelor's degree program at a four-year institution.

Common Job Titles

Archivist (includes Archival Records Clerk, Manuscripts Curator, Museum Archivist, University Archivist), Tour Guides (includes Discovery Guide, Docent, Historical Interpreter, Museum Educator), Historians, Curators, History Teachers, Reporters and Correspondents, Museum Technicians and Conservators

Many career opportunities in this field require completion of a bachelor's degree or higher.

Regional Labor Market Information

Historians: New workers generally start around \$36,343. Normal pay for Historians is \$64,758 per year, while highly experienced workers can earn as much as \$91,082 in this region. Over the last year, 6 companies have posted 9 jobs for Historians. There are currently 23 Historians that are employed in Austin-Round Rock, TX.

History Teachers: New workers generally start around \$31,294. Normal pay for History Teachers, Postsecondary is \$61,152 per year, while highly experienced workers can earn as much as \$104,721 in this region. There are currently 10,812 History Teachers, Postsecondary that are employed in Austin-Round Rock, TX.
