Program Description: The program is designed to give the student instruction in the areas of firefighting that are required to be certified in fire suppression. Instruction includes but is not limited to the following: Rules & regulations, forcible entry, ladder practices, fire streams, ventilation, rescue practices, inspection, automatic sprinklers, aircraft rescue and fire protection, self-contained breathing apparatus, and simulated emergency. The student works in a professionally staffed atmosphere with modern equipment.

Career Information

This course teaches the skills necessary to prepare the student for entry-level employment in the fire protection industry. Students who graduate can be certified Texas Commission on Fire Protection (TCFP) Basic Firefighters.

Regional Labor Market Information

Municipal Firefighters: New workers generally start around \$32,405. Normal pay for Municipal Firefighters is \$55,862 per year, while highly experienced workers can earn as much as \$82,894. Over the last year, 7 companies have posted 19 jobs for Municipal Firefighters in this region. There are currently 1,995 Municipal Firefighters that are employed in Austin-Round Rock, TX. Transfer Information

The Level 1 Firefighter Certificate prepares students to directly enter the workforce in fire service. Twelve hours in this program can transfer into ACC's Associate of Applied Science in Fire Protection Technology.

The Fire Protection Technology AAS is aimed at students who do not plan to work toward a 4- year degree; however, a Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences (BAAS) is an excellent alternative to a BA or BS degree. These degrees apply non-transferable courses and work experience towards the degree. You still must meet general education requirements and take upper level courses.
