It offers significant opportunities for creative and professional development, introduces beginning students to materials and methods, and challenges experienced art students to develop and refine their body of work. While this program is generally for those pursuing a higher degree before entering the workforce, the knowledge, skills, and abilities obtained will be valuable in a wide-range of occupations and is not limited to the common job titles listed.

Regional Labor Market Information

Fine Artists, Including Painters, Sculptors, and Illustrators: New workers generally start around \$18,258. Normal pay for Fine Artists, Including Painters, Sculptors, and Illustrators is \$25,839 per year, while highly experienced workers can earn as much as \$33,821 in this region. There are currently 518 Fine Artists, Including Painters, Sculptors, and Illustrators that are employed in Austin-Round Rock, TX.
