#### **Common Job Titles**

Multimedia Artists and Animators (includes Storyboard Artist, Character Designer or 2D Animator).

Create special effects, animation, or other visual images using film, video, computers, or other electronic tools and media for use in products or creations, such as computer games, movies, music videos, and commercials.

#### **Regional Labor Market Information**

New workers generally start around \$35,069. Normal pay for Multimedia Artists and Animators is \$56,353 per year, while highly experienced workers can earn as much as \$83,502. Over the last year, 37 companies have posted 211 jobs for Multimedia Artists and Animators in this region. There are currently 658 Multimedia Artists and Animators that are employed in Austin-Round Rock, TX.
