Actors: New workers generally start around \$22,382. Normal pay for Actors is \$37,321 per year, while highly experienced workers can earn as much as \$76,992 in this region. There are currently 324 Actors that are employed in Austin-Round Rock, TX.

Directors: New workers generally start around \$24,660. Normal pay for Directors- Stage, Motion Pictures, Television, and Radio is \$47,411 per year, while highly experienced workers can earn as much as \$100,526 in this region. There are currently 1,838 Directors- Stage, Motion Pictures, Television, and Radio that are employed in Austin-Round Rock, TX.

Set and Exhibit Designers: New workers generally start around \$26,206. Normal pay for Set and Exhibit Designers is \$36,862 per year, while highly experienced workers can earn as much as \$53,388 in this region.
