Career Information

Common Job Titles

Photographers (includes Photographer's Assistants, Owner/Photographer, Photo Editor, Studio Owner).

This career track is intended for image-makers in the professional world that understand the need for both still and moving image capture. Opportunities exist for both the retail and commercial markets. Jobs in this area are usually independent contractors and self-employed.

Regional Labor Market Information

Photographers: New workers generally start around \$25,731. Normal pay for Photographers is \$33,584 per year, while highly experienced workers can earn as much as \$42,867. Over the last year, 20 companies have posted 179 jobs for Photographers in this region. There are currently 1,160 Photographers that are employed in Austin-Round Rock, TX.
