Reporters and Correspondents: New workers generally start around \$24,848. Normal pay for Reporters and Correspondents is \$39,398 per year, while highly experienced workers can earn as much as \$64,645. Over the last year, 40 companies have posted 266 jobs for Reporters and Correspondents in this region. There are currently 221 Reporters and Correspondents that are employed in Austin-Round Rock, TX.

Audio and Video Equipment Technicians: New workers generally start around \$25,712. Normal pay for Audio and Video Equipment Technicians is \$44,196 per year, while highly experienced workers can earn as much as \$69,095. Over the last year, 68 companies have posted 455 jobs for Audio and Video Equipment Technicians in this region. There are currently 776 Audio and Video Equipment Technicians that are employed in Austin-Round Rock, TX.
