Regional Labor Market Information

First-Line Supervisors of Retail Sales Workers: New workers generally start around \$26,987. Normal pay for First-Line Supervisors of Retail Sales Workers is \$38,655 per year, while highly experienced workers can earn as much as \$66,484. Over the last year, 848 companies have posted 7,286 jobs for First-Line Supervisors of Retail Sales Workers. There are currently 8,809 First-Line Supervisors of Retail Sales Workers that are employed in Austin-Round Rock, TX.

You still must meet general education requirements and take upper level courses.
