Program Description: The Hotel and Restaurant Specialization degree offers hospitality management majors with a basic background in hotel and restaurant operations, which is fundamental to all aspects of the hospitality industry. This degree offers an array of specialized hospitality courses. Course instruction includes hands-on laboratory experience and extensive interaction with the hotel and restaurant industry as well as traditional classroom lectures and demonstrations. All students seeking this degree will need to be advised by the instructional program to finalize course selections. Complimentary award plans are Hospitality Management Certificate, Culinary Arts Certificate, Meeting Planning Certificate, and Travel and Tourism Certificate. Transfer credits may also be considered.

Over the last year, 271 companies have posted 4,100 jobs for Food Service Managers in this region. There are currently 2,064 Food Service Managers that are employed in Austin-Round Rock, TX.
