# **Criminal Justice: Texas Peace Officer Sequence**

Certificate: Texas Peace Officer Sequence Level 1 (C1)



#### PUBLIC & SOCIAL SERVICES

**Program Description:** This program is the academic equivalent to the Basic Peace Officer Training Course required by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement (<u>TCOLE</u>) for all Texas Peace Officers to be licensed. The Texas Peace Officer Specialization Associate of Applied Science degree will also satisfy the degree requirement rule by TCOLE in the Academic Alternative program.

The Criminal Justice Program Coordinator (Department Chair) must approve all enrollments into any peace officer sequence courses one semester prior to registration. Before a student can register for any sequence courses in this program, the following documents and

requirements must be received and satisfied in compliance with TCOLE rules, state law and ACC policy: criminal records check and FBI fingerprinting, drug free report, physical examination, psychological examination, proof of U.S. citizenship, valid driver's license, DD-214 if military, college transcript, and any other documentation that may be required.

A degree is NOT required prior to entering the program but must be obtained before being granted the endorsement required to sit for the state exam. Students must have, at minimum, an associate's degree (does not have to be in criminal justice) before receiving the endorsement.

Students transferring into this program from other institutions with criminal justice accredited academic hours, may be allowed to receive transfer credit if comparable with ACC Criminal Justice courses and meet TCOLE standards.

Students with non-criminal justice degrees must successfully complete all seven Core Courses and the four Peace Officer Sequence courses in the Texas Peace Officer Sequence Level 1 Certificate award plan. Students without degrees must satisfactorily complete the associate's degree with the seven Core Courses and the four Peace Officer Sequence courses. All students in the Texas Peace Officer Sequence Level 1 Certificate program must pass a comprehensive program examination and apply for graduation from the 38 credit hours certificate program before the Academic Endorsement of Eligibility can be issued. The Academic Endorsement of Eligibility qualifies and permits a student to take the Peace Officer Licensing Examination which is prepared and administered by TCOLE. Meet with the Criminal Justice Program Coordinator for more information.

## **Career Information**

By completing the Texas Peace Officer Sequence Certification, along with completing the CJ-Law Enforcement degree, the student will be eligible to take the state peace officer license exam. All peace officers in the state of Texas must obtain the license issued by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement in order to be perform peace officer duties. By obtaining the license the job market is broadened as most police agencies required the license before application for peace officer positions will be accepted.

Police Patrol Officers (includes Law Enforcement Officer, Officer, Patrol Officer, Peace Officer, Police Officer, Police Patrol Officer, Public Safety Officer, State Trooper, Uniform Patrol Police Officer)

### **Regional Labor Market Information**

Police Patrol Officers: New workers generally start around \$43,261. Normal pay for Police Patrol Officers is \$70,172 per year, while highly experienced workers can earn as much as \$100,463. Over the last year, 43 companies have posted 594 jobs for Police Patrol Officers in this region. There are currently 4,541 Police Patrol Officers that are employed in Austin-Round Rock, TX. ## **Transfer Information**

The Texas Peace Officer Sequence Level 1 Certificate is designed for students who are preparing to take the Texas Peace Officer exam. Students must have, at minimum, an associate's degree (does not have to be in criminal justice) before being granted the endorsement required to sit for the state exam. Individual courses in this program may transfer to 4-year institutions, but students intending to transfer may want to follow the Criminal Justice Law Enforcement AAS degree plan. Students are strongly encouraged to work with their advisor to determine which courses will transfer.
