Program Description: This degree prepares students for entry-level work interpreting between users of American Sign Language and speakers of English in a variety of settings including education, medical, video relay, government and business, etc. Students will be prepared to work in face-to-face, video relay/remote interactions as well as translation of documents. Support for student success is provided through an ASL lab and tutors, extensive field work, mentoring by interpreters in the community, an ASL Student Club, and a strong and supportive deaf community.

Regional Labor Market Information

Interpreters and Translators: New workers generally start around \$36,016. Normal pay for Interpreters and Translators is \$60,506 per year, while highly experienced workers can earn as much as \$83,370. Over the last year, 35 companies have posted 514 jobs for Interpreters and Translators in this region. There are currently 660 Interpreters and Translators that are employed in Austin-Round Rock, TX.
